## Wednesday, September 20, 2017

### “Creating Beautiful and Functional Results with Composites” Speaker: Robert Marus, DDS

Registration & Continental Breakfast: 8 – 8:30 a.m.

**OBJECTIVE:** *This course will demonstrate, in a step-by-step fashion, how to place composites quickly and easily, so that an aesthetic result with a high success rate and predictable outcome can be achieved.*

**COURSE DESCRIPTION:** Today's restorative dentists need to enhance their cosmetic skills in order to achieve growth and profitability in their practices. This lecture will demonstrate a simplified method of restoring the fractured maxillary anterior central incisor with composite resin and how to and predictably treat posterior teeth, cervical (abfraction) lesions, and incisal wear with beauty, strength and function beyond patients expectations. Although the material science of composites has improved dramatically, the placement remains highly technique-sensitive.

#### Participants will also learn:

- How to quickly treat the classic fractured anterior tooth with a simplified composite layering technique
- Where to place opaque (dentin) and body (enamel) shades of composites
- How to restore the anterior fractures tooth by using only 2 shades of composite!
- Discuss the importance of polymerization shrinkage versus polymerization shrinking stress
- Learn to quickly place sensitive-free posterior composites with sealed subgingival margins
- Review how to predictably treat abfractions and incisal wear with composites.

### “Dental Pharmacology . . . Over Easy”

**OBJECTIVE:** *This program will provide dental professionals with a review of the essentials of pharmacology for the everyday practice of dentistry. Special emphasis will be given to care planning strategies and techniques for our medically-complex dental patients.*

**COURSE DESCRIPTION:** Throughout the course of their everyday practice, dental professionals must frequently draw upon their knowledge of pharmacology. However, armed with a relatively brief exposure to such vast subject matter, many dental professional have difficulty retaining this knowledge throughout their career.

#### Learning objectives:

- Describe the pharmacology and mechanisms of action of non-opioid analgesics, including their therapeutic effects, as well as their potential for abuse.
- Describe the pharmacology and mechanisms of action of dental local anesthetic agents with respect to their metabolism, adverse effects, drug interactions and contraindications.
- Describe the pharmacology of anti-infective agents commonly used in dentistry, including their indications for use, adverse effects, drug interactions and contraindications.
- Be able to identify the prescription medications most frequently encountered on a patient's medical history and discuss their clinical dental considerations and potential on dental therapy.
- Discuss the non-prescription medications most often used by dental patients and explain the clinical dental considerations of these agents and their potential on dental therapy.

*In addition to his contributions to the profession of pharmacy, Thomas A. Viola, R. Ph., C.C.P., also serves the dental professions as a clinical educator, published writer and professional speaker. He is well-known for his column in General Dentistry magazine, where he also serves on the publication's Advisory Board. ## Wednesday, March 21, 2018

### “Medical Emergencies: How to Save a Life (Including Your Own)” Speaker: Daniel Pompa DDS

**OBJECTIVE:** *Dr. Pompa will lecture dentists on “up to the minute” actions for dealing with a medical emergency while challenging preconceived or outdated ideas. This course will clearly delineate indications for emergency drug use and proper dosages, as well as demonstrate how to assemble and maintain an ideal emergency drug kit.*

**COURSE DESCRIPTION:** There are more medically compromised patients coming to our offices than ever before. “Controversial History” will be discussed and how it will uncover medical issues not revealed by the standard health history form. Additionally, participants will learn simple, non-invasive critical tests that can reduce overall risks. The newest techniques for drug administration will be shown for participants to hone their skills utilizing simulation models and real drugs. Attendees will receive and review color-coded instructional cards depicting the most common life-threatening situations with algorithms providing an easy to follow action plan for both the dentist and team members. We will also review the legal and moral obligations that are presented during a medical crisis.

*Daniel Pompa D.D.S., is a fellow of the American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons and the International Congress of Oral Implantologists. Dr. Pompa has been a guest lecturer at Columbia University College of Dental Medicine, New York University College of Dentistry and the University of Florida College of Dentistry. He has lectured both internationally and in 2013 became a seminar series speaker/consultant of the American Dental Association. Dr. Pompa is an author, having published in such journals as JADA and the NYSAGD Journal as well as Dentistry Today where he has been listed as a “Leader in Continuing Education.” Dr. Pompa is also an inventor, having been issued a patent for his innovative work in the field of dental implantology.*

### “Transitions in the Life of Your Dental Practice”

**OBJECTIVE:** *To review the process of buying or selling an existing dental practice with respect to issues that faces both the buyer and seller.*

**COURSE DESCRIPTION:** Dr. Paul Goodman's seminar will focus on understanding the impacts of buying and selling dental practices. Having bought three successful practices himself, he will discuss the logistical, legal and financial factors that may arise when trying to acquire a new practice, or sell one.

#### Learning objectives:

- The impact of certain due diligence items, restrictive covenants (include non-compete and non-solicitation provisions), accounts receivable, defective/prepaid work provisions and the specific legal concerns stemming from a partial buy-in.
- Understand why a strong profit and cash flow is essential to successful practice transition.
- Review the impact of insurance participation on a practice sale.

In addition, he will stress the importance of assembling a strong team of advisors to help guide dentists through the process.
